It was reviewed seriously and these DHOs were directed to explain their position within 10 days for low achievement.

(Action to be taken: All concerned officers)

3.10 SOM

W/DGH informed in the house that the funds sanctioned inder SOM in the year 2017-18 may be considered approved for the year 2018-19.

(Action to be taken by All DHOs)

Agenda No. 4: Review the progress of departmental Centres & GGNs.

Deputy Director Horticulture/P&N directed all concerned to send the proposals for minor repair of nurseries, sale counters & centers if required and also addition like boundary walls for nurseries to this directorate immediately so that the proposal can be evaluated and sanctioned

(Action to be taken by All DHOs)

Agenda No. 5: Discussion on Annual Action Plan 2018-19 of departmental schemes.

The Annual Action Plan of all departmental schemes for the year 2018-19 were discussed at length and it was directed by W/DGH to complete the allotted targets as per the Annual Action Plan. The Annual Action Plan of MI scheme has been prepared with the consent of all DHOs and handed over to all the DHOs. However, the Annual Action Plan of others schemes will be sent to the field offices shortly.

(Action to be taken by All DHOs)

Agenda No. 6: Action Plan & Cropping Plan of all Centres & GGNs for the year 2018-19.

Action Plan & Cropping Plan for all Centres & GGNs discussed with all concerned in detail and instructed to send the information within a week.

(Action to be taken by All DHOs)

Agenda No. 7: Proposal from FTs for selling products obtained/prepared after imparting training to trainees at Food Technology Labs.

It was directed by W/DGH to all Food Technologist to send the proposal for selling products obtained/prepared after imparting training to trainees at Food Technology Labs so as to know the quality & progress of the training. After detail discussion with DGH it was finalized that the training will remain of 4 days duration as such. Further, it is decided that no bags, tea, lunch & fare will be given to participants. The whole money earmarked for these items will be transferred into accounts of participants directly. Only Rs. 40/-may be spent on pen & pad which is given to participants. Further, it was also decided that FTs will ensure the sale of prepared produce minimum to double of the price of input purchased.

(Action to be taken by DDH/PP)

Agenda No. 8:Review on requirements of Computers of Multifunction
Printer (MFP)/Biometric Machine etc. along with present
status at district level/DDH and at centres.

The requirement of above items were discussed in length with all field officers and the requirement of computers was taken on the spot. It was directed to ensure Biometric attendance in offices/centres. The issue related to non-working of internet was noted by DDH/PP and intimated by some DHOs. The IT-Expert was directed to immediately resolve the matter. The DHOs were asked to condemn all junk desktops if they are not working and their age is more than described age after repairing from their stock register.

9.1 It was also directed to all the Officers in the house that top priority should be given to court case, CM Announcement, CM Grievances & RTI.

9.2 The quarterly expenditure for the year 2017-18 was discussed & it was targeted that minimum quarterly expenditure shall be as: 1st quarter-5%, 2nd quarter 25%, 3rd quarter 35%, 4th quarter 35%.

- 9.3 It was directed to field functionary for submitting the ACR upto 20 April of the year.
- 9.4 It was also directed to all the DHOs to submit the reports of all schemes upto 5^{th} of every month.

- 9.5 Accounts Officer informed that due to wrong Bank Account detail sent by the DHOs the subsidy of the farmer under Micro Irrigation Scheme could not be sent in their account which is very seriously view by W/DGH. It has been directed to all concerned that the bank account details of the farmers may be thoroughly checked to avoid inconvenience in future.
- 9.6 Accounts Officer also informed that all concerned should send the attendance report of the employees working through outsourcing upto 2nd day of every month so that the salary may be released timely.
- 9.7 All the field officers were directed to send the requirement of staff if any within a week time and ensure that work should not suffer at any cost in lieu of shortage of staff.
- 9.8 DHO, Kaithal informed that agriculture department intimated that 4.0 Kanal of land adjoining to horticulture department belongs to agriculture department and agriculture department want to construct boundary. It is directed by W/DGH that relevant land record may be shown and sent to agriculture department and not to allow construction on land belongs to horticulture department.
